Celebration of ICCR Foundation Day

In connection with the Foundation Day of the Indian Council for Cultural Relations (9 April 1950), a vibrant performance by the Bastar Band, an ICCR troupe from Chattisgarh, was held at the premises of the High Commission of India today. The Bastar Band, a group of heritage keepers, represents the entire Bastaria community, its traditional tales, myths, evolution, deities, customs and musical instruments that are on the verge of extinction.

On the occasion, a 'Brides of India' show by the Indian Women's Association (IWA), Abuja was also held, at which bridal dresses worn by Indian women from different states of India were shown, along with an Indian wedding display. IWA also handed over donations to select charity organizations of Nigeria.

Speaking on the occasion, Dr. Abasubong Samson Idiong, (PhD), Instructional Lecturer & Research Supervisor at the Faculty of Social Sciences, National Open University of Nigeria, who completed his PhD in Rural and Community Development at the Department of African Studies, University of Delhi from 1995-1998, expressed his deep appreciation for the ICCR scholarship programme for graduate, post-graduate and doctoral studies in India, which has contributed immensely to people-to-people level ties between India and Nigeria.

General elections in India, the largest democratic exercise in the world, are underway, and a short film on the elections was shown on the occasion.
