Closing ceremony of commemoration of the 150th Birth Anniversary Year of Mahatma Gandhi

The two year-long celebrations to mark the 150th birth anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi, launched on 2 October 2018, ended in Nigeria today with the Closing Ceremonyorganised by the High Commission of India, Abuja. H.E. Mr. Geoffrey Onyeama, Minister of Foreign Affairs of the Federal Republic of Nigeria was the Chief Guest of the event and addressed the audience in virtual mode.

On the occasion, excerpts of Prime Minister of India's address on Mahatma Gandhi at United Nationson the occasion of Gandhi@150, were shown. It was followed by a digital projection of key moments of Gandhiji's life, his inspiring quotes, discourses and initiatives, highlighting the relevance of Mahatma's life and philosophy in the contemporary world. A video showcasing various commemorative activities undertaken by India's Missions abroad marking Gandhi@150, was also shown. It was followed by a Skit on the life of Mahatma Gandhi performed by the Nigerian artists of the 'Arojah Royal Theatre', Abuja.

Speaking on the Occasion, High Commissioner recalled the importance of Gandhi ji's African experiences in shaping his life and philosophy. He conveyed his gratitude to H.E. Over 100 guests attended the combined event at the High Commission of India, Abuja and its Office in Lagos, including prominent Nigerian dignitaries, diplomatic corps, members of Association of Nigerian alumni of Indian Universities, and members of the Indian community. The event was telecast live on High Commission's facebook page. A Photo Exhibition, with a collection of photographs from the Gandhi National Museum, New Delhi, on Mahatma Gandhi's life and message, was also held at the venue. The event concluded with an interactive session between the High Commissioner and Heads of Indian community organizations in Lagos, followed by a vegetarian lunch.
